Wolds Ward Laceby Update December 2023

Crime

There have been one seven reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for November. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

On 2nd November a disability badge was stolen from a vehicle parked on Grimsby Road.

On 7th November intruders broke into the caravan yard on Caistor Road. They hooked up a motor home onto another vehicle and drove away.

Other crimes include:

One assault.

Four reports of harassment.

Two minor public order offence.

One report of sending malicious communications.

There were two reports of ASB within Laceby village, both in relation to youths on the St Francis Park causing issues to a resident.
