Wolds Ward Laceby Update October 2023

Crime

There have been fifty-two reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for September. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

Sometime between 18th & 20th September items of property have either been moved or taken from a home on St Francis Crescent.

Overnight 27th & 28th September a home on Harneis Crescent was entered via the rear door. Keys to the family car were stolen which were then used to steal the car.

Overnight 18th & 19th September intruders entered a building plot off Blythe Way. Building materials were stolen from the site as well as plant tools from a garage.

During the evening of 1st September, a car parked on its driveway on Cemetery Road was stolen.

Overnight 16th & 17th September at two separate addresses on Blythe Way, two cars were approached by a person trying car door handles. No entry was gained.

Four reports of harassment.

Three minor public order offence.
