## Wolds Ward Laceby Update April 2023

## Crime

There have been thirty-seven reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for March. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

Overnight 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> March, a garage was broken into at a property on Cooper Road. A childs motorbike was stolen. This was later found dumped in bushes nearby.

There have been two burglaries at the Marshall BMW garage. The first occurred during the early hours of 13<sup>th</sup> March when entry was gained through the main showroom doors. A quantity of motorcycle gloves were stolen.

About 6.20am on 17<sup>th</sup> March force was used to break through a door to the showroom. A large quantity of motorcycle clothing was stolen.

During the early hours of 25<sup>th</sup> March there were six incidents of vehicle crime.

On Daisy Drive, an insecure car was entered and a laptop and ipad were stolen from the boot. Vehicles at two other properties had their doors tried, but no entry was made. A vehicle parked on Blythe Way was entered and searched. A locking wheel nut socket was stolen. Vehicles on Cooper Lane also had their doors tried but no entry gained. A vehicle parked on Cemetery Road was entered but nothing was stolen.

Other crimes include:

- On 20<sup>th</sup> March a van went to the rear yard of the Marshall BMW garage and stole numerous car parts valued at over £12,000 that were being returned to BMW.
- One assault.
- One report of sending malicious communications.
- Four reports of minor public order incidents.
- There were two reports of ASB within Laceby village.
- Scooters causing issues to residents on Keith Crescent.
- Illegal riding of motorbikes on Hawerby Road.
