Wolds Ward Laceby Update March 2024

Crime

There have been twenty six recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for February. Of those, the following have been reported in Laceby Village.

Between 15th January and 11th February, a moped was stolen from its address on Lauridson Close. The moped was later found abandoned in a field at Stallingborough.

Overnight 6th & 7th February, a car that had been parked on Butt Lane with the keys still in the ignition was stolen.

On 14th February a car parked on Field Close was damaged after a known male kicked the vehicle.

Other crime include:

Two assaults.

Three reports of harassment.

There has been one report of ASB within Laceby village, in relation loud music from a property on Daisy Drive.
