Wolds Ward Laceby Update February 2022

Crime

There were twenty-three reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for January. Eight of these were reported in Laceby village.

A car that was found abandoned on Caistor Road, with damage to the front wheels and bodywork, was later reported stolen from Keith Crescent.

A car was damaged on Hawerby Road after an implement was used to cause scratches and dents in the bodywork.

A car parked on St Francis Grove was damaged after an implement was used to scratch the bodywork.

The other offences were two assaults, three minor public order incidents.

There were two reports of ASB.

A drunk male was causing issues on Cooper Lane throwing objects at properties.
