Wolds Ward Laceby Update January 2022

Crime

There were twenty nine reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for December. Eleven of these were reported in Laceby village.

There have been eight reports of criminal damage around the village. Four youth's original involved in the throwing of apples at properties have been dealt with in the presence of their parents. Patrols have been carried out in the village. These will continue; however, it seems that there are further incidents occurring probably involving different people. If anybody has information, or has been a victim of crime, please report this to the police.

A car that was found abandoned on Caistor Road, with damage to the front wheels and bodywork, was later reported stolen from Keith Crescent.

The other offences were an assault and a domestic related harassment.

There was one report of ASB which was a neighbour dispute.
