

Wolds Ward Laceby Update July 2022

Crime

There were forty four reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for June. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

During the early hours of 13th June an attempt was made to steal a motorbike from the driveway of an address on Butt Lane. Damage was caused to the steering column, but the bike was left in situ.

Other crime include:

Damage caused to a new build property on Blythe Way by smashing the glass in the rear door. Two domestic related reports of damage with the home. One assault.

One minor public order.

Two offences of blackmail by demanding money over images shared over social media.

An offence of sending inappropriate photos over social media.

There were no reports of ASB.
