Wolds Ward Laceby Update May 2022

Crime

There were thirty-five reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for April. Seventeen of these were reported in Laceby village.

There were two reports of Criminal Damage. A vehicle parked outside its address on St Francis Grove was damaged after bodywork was scratched on a door. The other was a domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime include:

Eleven assaults, six of which were domestic related involving the same juvenile offender.

Theft of a bike from Lauridson Close.

Theft of a golf buggy from Laceby Manor golf course.

There was one report of ASB, whereby a male has been subject to abuse on several occasions as he has ridden his bike along the road.
