10841 Declarations of Interest
None declared at this meeting,

10842 Dispensations
No dispensations requested received.

10843 Public Forum
Churchyard Wall mentioned – early stages of looking into this.
Footpath in Gibraltar Lane – informed Public Rights of Way officers of the problems in person and will email copy of letter to Parish Council regarding this matter to them too.

10844 Planning Matters
DC/68/13/WOL – Change of use from motor home showroom to a warehouse and storage facility (Class B8) at 148 Caistor Road Laceby.

The Clerk informed those present that the Planning Officer had advised her that transit vans or similar – no HGV's, were to be used to transport stock to and from the warehouse, and that the stock would be electrical equipment.

It was therefore resolved that no objections be raised to this planning application.

Proposed Diversion of Bridleway no: 101 Laceby
It was noted that a diversion to one of the bridleways was being requested by a farmer in the area. It was resolved to leave this matter in abeyance for the next meeting whilst checks were made on the realignment of the bridleway before making comments to the planning department.

10845 Office Computer
The Clerk informed those present that she was without a computer and that the information in respect of summons letters and agendas for the meeting that evening had been typed on her own personal laptop.

The Clerk had brought with her two quotations for computers – one from Curry's/PCWorld for their cheapest laptop plus Office Professional was over

£700.00; the other quotation for a similar specification computer with Windows 7 operating system and Office Student and Home would be £424.74.

It was proposed by Councillor Metcalf and seconded by Councillor James that a computer should be purchased from @PC at a cost of £424.74 inclusive of VAT, this was resolved unanimously.
