Wolds Ward Laceby Update August 2024

Crime

There have been twenty seven recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for July. Of these, the following have been reported in Laceby Village.

On the evening of 21st July, a lodge at Laceby Manor Golf Course was broken into. Car keys were stolen which were then used to steal the car, which was parked outside, whilst the owner was at his wedding reception. The vehicle was later recovered in Grimsby.

Other crimes include:

One report of assault.

Three reports of harassment.

One report of minor public order.

Theft of a mobility scooter from a rear garden of a property on Grimsby Road.

There have been no reports of ASB within Laceby village.
