Wolds Ward Laceby Update May 2024

Crime

There have been forty-seven recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for April. Of these, the following have been reported in Laceby Village.

During the early hours of 11th April, two males are captured on cctv as they entered a farm premises on Lopham Lane. A roller shutter door on a barn was forced to gain entry. A second barn door was also forced. It is unknown if anything has been stolen.

During the late evening of 16th April, an insecure car parked on its drive on Barton Street was entered and searched. Keys were stolen. The thief made off on a motorbike.

Wheelie bins were set alight at Cottagers Plot on 5th April.

Other crime include:

One assault.

Seven reports of harassment.

One minor public order incident.

There have been two reports of ASB within Laceby village, both relating to the kicking of footballs against houses on Church Lane.
