Wolds Ward Laceby Update February

There have been thirty six recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for January. There were seventeen reported crimes in Laceby village.

During the evening of 6th January, someone tried door handles to a flat on Cemetery Road. The door was secure, and no entry was gained.

Overnight 14th & 15th January, four alloy wheels were stolen from a car left on the forecourt of Alexandra Motors at Laceby Roundabout.

Other crime include:

Five assaults.

Theft of metal from a garden on Stanford Close.

An offence of stalking.

Four offences of harassment.

Theft of money by an employee from a business account.

A making off without payment for fuel from Laceby Lodge Services.

There have been no reports of ASB within Laceby village.
