Wolds Ward Laceby Update July

There have been fifty-one recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for June. There were twenty-six reported crimes in Laceby village. Of these, the following have occurred.

Two domestic burglaries were reported.
Field Close a door has been forced and items stolen.
Kenmar Road which is domestic related.

On 13th June, a vehicle was set alight on Old Chapel Lane which spread to a nearby fence and facias.
Theft of tools from a vehicle parked on Cemetery Road.
Nine assaults.
One report of harassment.
One minor public order incident.
There was one report of ASB which was a neighbour issue.
