## **Wolds Ward Laceby Update March**

There have been twenty-nine recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for February. There were fourteen reported crimes in Laceby village.

During the evening of 14<sup>th</sup> February, a known male attended an address on Field Close, Laceby and was seen to try the door handle. No entry was gained.

Overnight 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> February a car parked on Field Close was damaged by using an implement to scratch the boot door.

A sign placed on the front garden date has been damaged at a property on Field Close between 17<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> February.

## Other crime include:

- Two assaults.
- Three offences of harassment.
- Three reports of minor public order.
- One offence of sending malicious communications.
- Theft of an eBike from stables on Cottagers Plot.
- A shop theft from the Co-Op on Caistor Road.

There have been four reports of ASB within Laceby village.

Two reports of a homeless man causing issues at the Co-Op.

Two separate reports of children playing football in the street on Church Lane.
