Wolds Ward Laceby Update July 2024

Crime

There have been twenty seven recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for June to date (26th). Of these, the following have been reported in Laceby Village.

Around 6.30pm on 17th June, a male went to a home on Caistor Road. He went to the rear where he tried the door handle. The door was locked, so he then looked through the rear windows before making his way from the premises.

Other crime include: Theft of a parcel left outside an address on Butt Lane. A domestic related criminal damage Two domestic related assaults. One report of stalking and one harassment. One minor public order incident.

There have been no reports of ASB within Laceby village.
